

Treatment and Probation Tracking Program

COURT ORDERS PROBATION

Assessment and Tools

- OST, FROST, AND ASUS
- Client Satisfaction Survey
- COA to have weekly contact with Probationer
- COA contacts provider one time per week

CASELOAD

- TWO COAs per 25 probationers

Length in Program

- Minimum one year during pilot program
- 3+ years if grant funded

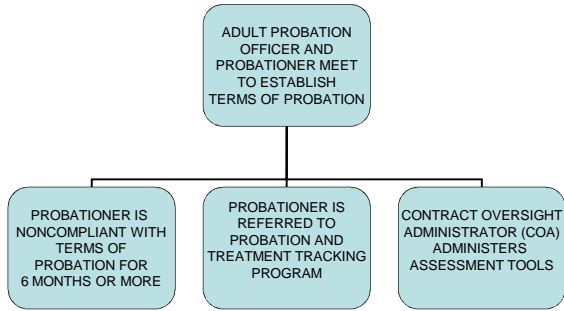
Eligibility Requirements

- 18+ years of age
- On probation for a minimum of 6 months and have at least 18 months of probation time
- Be noncompliant for at least 6 months
- Probationer may be at risk for PTR
- Resident of Maricopa County
- Site Locations: WRC; BCB; PSC

Advantages to treatment and probation tracking program

- Referral to treatment after proper assessment by a clinician
- Monitoring by a clinician
- Multi-team approach to treatment
- Client centered treatment (self-report surveys on progress each session)
- Questionnaires to be completed by probationer
- If grant funding is obtained:
 - More resources in community
 - Wrap around services
 - Training and monitoring of providers for compliance with contract
 - Cognitive restructuring pre-treatment and every 4 months
 - Services available for co-occurring disorders

PROBATION BEGINS



CONTRACT OVERSIGHT ADMINISTRATOR'S DUTIES

- DISCUSS REFERRAL WITH ADULT PROBATION OFFICER (APO)
- MEET WITH PROBATIONER REGARDING NONCOMPLIANCE
- ASSESS PROBATIONER UTILIZING ASSESSMENT TOOLS
- DISCUSS WITH PROBATIONER ANY ISSUES CONFLICTING WITH COMPLIANCE
- COMPLETE MASTER TREATMENT PLAN WITH PROBATIONER
- STAFF CASE WITH TEAM TO DETERMINE APPROPRIATE REFERRAL
- DISCUSS REFERRAL WITH TREATMENT PROVIDER
- MEET OR CONTACT FAMILY MEMBERS, EMPLOYERS, FRIENDS TO DETERMINE PROBATIONER IS FOLLOWING TERMS OF PROBATION AND TREATMENT
- BE AVAILABLE TO COMMUNITY REGARDING PROBATIONER
- COMPLETE MONTHLY REPORTS TO THE PROBATION OFFICER ON THE PROBATIONER'S PROGRESS OR LACK OF PROGRESS
- MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE COURT REGARDING STATUS OF PROBATIONER
- LIST IS NOT INCLUSIVE. DUTIES ARE ADDED AS REQUIRED BY THE STATUS OF TERMS OF PROBATION

PROBATIONER'S DUTIES

- MEET WITH PROBATION ON A REGULAR BASIS AS SET BY TERMS OF PROBATION
- PAY FINES
- FIND OR MAINTAIN A JOB
- COMPLETE COMMUNITY SERVICE HOURS
- MONITOR PROGRESS IN TREATMENT, IF REFERRED
- MAINTAIN CURRENT ADDRESS AND PHONE CONTACT
- ATTEND TREATMENT
- COMPLETE ORS/SYS
- COMPLETE THOUGHT REPORTS WEEKLY

SUCCESSFUL OUTCOMES

- Probationer graduates from IPS/probation
- Probationers reports changes in thinking patterns
- Probationers reports changes in belief system
- Recidivism is reduced
- Support groups are formed to assist in reinforcing changed + actions

- Literature review
- Grant writing
- Collecting Data
